REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION: These activities are special privileges for 8th graders with good citizenship. Please review pages 10-17 of your student agenda to review the *CVMS Code of Conduct*.

HOW IS A STUDENT "PLACED" ON THE LOP LIST?

1. 5 or more detentions (ex: tardy/discipline)
2. Any combination of 1 Friday Night School + 3 or more detentions
3. 2 Friday Night School assignments
4. Suspension (In-School or At-Home)
 - a. Cyber-Suspension (next discipline infraction following the cyber-suspension = placed on the list)
5. At Mr. Adams or Mrs. Dolnik's discretion

**BEGINS MONDAY
MARCH 12th, 2018**

Students who are placed on the LOP list WILL NOT be eligible for the eighth-grade activities listed above. Any student placed on the LOP list after June 4, 2018 will not be able to earn their way off the list. A student, who has purchased a Knott's ticket and then has his/her privileges revoked, will only be refunded the cost of the Knott's ticket (\$33). Bus transportation and meal vouchers cost cannot be refunded.

CAN A STUDENT BE REMOVED FROM THE LOP LIST? Yes, however ALL of the following terms must be met:

- 1) No more than 2 attendance-related detentions after being placed on the list
- 2) No more than 1 behavior-related detention after being placed on the list
- 3) No additional suspensions after being placed on the list
- 4) No additional Friday Night Schools after being placed on the list
- 5) Student successfully completes a Personal Reflection/Persuasive Essay where he/she states specifically why he/she should be removed from the LOP list. An administrator will provide details of the essay to applicable students; the final date to turn an essay in will be on Friday, May 25th by 3:05 pm.
- 6) With Mr. Adams or Mrs. Dolnik's approval.

IMPORTANT: All students are required to return textbooks to their teachers and pay ALL textbook and library book fines from the Learning Commons. Students with outstanding fines and/or textbooks will not be eligible for end of the year activities.
