Message from the Principal

Greetings Bobcat Community,

I'd like to begin today's message by asking you to join me in acknowledging the outstanding work of the CVMS teaching staff. Six months ago, our teachers and entire staff were handed what seemed like an impossible situation with continually evolving unknowns. I am so proud of what our teachers have been able to deliver thus far. Our teachers' commitment to supporting students, and each other, has not wavered and I believe that it's shown.

I'd also like to acknowledge you as a parent - during this time, you've also undoubtedly been working to navigate these challenging times for yourself, your family, and your children.

To that end, I'd like to make a request, so that we can best support one another as a community:

Given our constant communication to bring our school to optimal function and support for all students, we are all experiencing a significant increase in email volume. Finally, the question remains: when will schools open? As superintendent Dr. Haley shared in the second quarter update, we know that distance learning is an interruption to how we teach our students and how they learn. We know the toll this is taking on our families and communities. We know it is not ideal and we look forward to the day when we can return everyone to our campuses. We understand that some elementary schools have opened; however, among other things, the instructional delivery model with one teacher with one set of students, allows them to comply with the CDPH guidelines. In networking with secondary schools across the state we have found that we are all facing the same barriers in trying to reopen in compliance with CDPH guidelines. Until the guidance changes we will continue prioritizing targeted student groups while exploring opportunities for on-campus student connectedness.

Counseling Update

Balancing our life activities is crucial for all of us and a skill that our middle schoolers are still developing. One of the best ways we can teach them about life balance is to be positive role models so that can see what a healthy life balance looks like. Are we as adults, taking time for ourselves, getting all the sleep, exercise, good nutrition and balance of family and work time that we need? Too often, this answer is no. In this extremely stressful time, our modeling of life balance is more important than ever. Remember while our tweens and teens may not remember everything that we say, they rarely forget what we do. As Mr. Adams mentioned above, there are things we can do to help bring more of a balance to the school/home balance.

- -Use AERIES to check grades rather than email teachers right away. If there is a pattern emerging, please contact your counselor.
- -Remember that this early in the year, there may not be a lot of grades, so one missing assignment skews things negatively. This will be balanced out as more assignments and tests are completed.
- -Be sure your student knows how to use Google Classroom calendars to track assignments. If you would like to know what assignments are, have students print out a copy of the calendar and post it where it is visible to everyone. All students were given a CVMS Agenda to keep track of assignments. We highly recommend students write assignments and other events, like sports, tutoring, family events, in their agenda so they can have all of this important in one place.
- -Let Your student Advocate for Themselves. This is the age where students need to learn to self advocate. This is a skill they are learning and one that should be encouraged. If your student has questions, please have them use daily student support time or asynchronous class time to write questions or meet directly with their teachers. Often, this communication is what students need to clarify things and can then proceed to finish assignments. Please check here for the student support schedule.

Give Grace- to your student, school staff and yourself. We are all working hard for student success during a challenging time.
