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ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

We have seen an uptick in behavior in the past couple of weeks. Students were presented with a reset of behavioral expectations. This presentation took place in PE classes this past Monday. You can access the presentation <u>here</u>. Please take a moment to review this information with your student.

In particular, we have seen an uptick in academic dishonesty and inappropriate communication between students, be it verbal or electronic communication. Below are excerpts from the CVMS Handbook to remind families about behavioral expectations, and the consequences that may be levied if those expectations are not met.

- Academic Honesty Policy Honest behavior is an expectation for all students in the San Dieguito Union High School District. The purpose of this regulation is to create and maintain an ethical academic atmosphere. Any alleged violation of this policy will be investigated thoroughly and appropriate disciplinary measures will be taken consistent with SDUHSD School Board policy. Depending on the severity of the offense, one or more of the following consequences may occur:
 - Referral to the Assistant Principal and the parent/guardian will be contacted.
 - Loss of all credit for the assignment or test with no makeup permitted.
 - Placement on an Academic Honesty Contract.
 Detention
 - Continued offense, Suspension for School

• Respectfulness - Students will treat peers and all school staff, including substitutes, with respect. Any violation of this expectation will be investigated and appropriate disciplinary measures will be taken consistent with SDUHSD School Board policy. Depending on the severity of the offense, one or more of the following consequences may occur:

- Parent Contact
- Detention
- Behavior Contract
- Habitual or severe infraction, Suspension from School

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Message from the Superintendent's Office

Good Afternoon SDUHSD Community,

As we begin the second half of the school year, I extend my sincere appreciation for your unwavering support and involvement in our educational community. I am pleased to share that the SDUHSD District Office modernization project has reached completion. Our district office, located at 710 Encinitas Boulevard, is now open for operations from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm.

At our board meeting this week, we received an annual update from Pacific Trails Middle School and an overview presentation of the SDUHSD student performance data as summarized on the California Dashboard. Overall, we have a lot to celebrate.

- Our students continue to have high levels of academic achievement. - Our high schools have very high graduation rates, and our middle schools have seen a decline in chronic absenteeism.

As we move forward and use the Dashboard to inform our Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP), we are going to be paying close attention to specialized student groups.

Additional Board Meeting Highlights

Aquatics Facility at Torrey Pines: The Board stated its intent to build an aquatics facility at Torrey Pines High School and directed the Superintendent to collaborate with staff and the community to present details about how to fund and accomplish this project.

Governance Handbook: This is a document that is agreed upon by the Superintendent and all five members of the Board of Education which outlines how the team will work together. Approval of this handbook, a first for SDUHSD, is a reflection of the governance team's commitment to working effectively in a way that best benefits all students.

As Superintendent, together with the Governing Board, we are united in providing a highquality education for each and every student to demonstrate academic growth and optimize individual potential.
