COUNSELOR'S CORNER

Eighth grade families, if you are interested in enrolling in the online learning program (OLP) for high school, sign ups are currently underway and will end on March 29th.at 4:00. Please note that there will be **no** middle school OLP next year with the exception of currently enrolled seventh graders.

We are all concerned about the amount of time that students spend on line. The use of 1:1 chromebooks presents unique challenges, since so many assignments are online. There is the ease of having all work in one place weighed against the ability students have to simply open an new tab and play games or watch You Tube while they are in class or studying at home. We use Go Guardian as well as filters to help monitor what students have access to at school. The chromebook page on the district tech hub has information about this. The Common SenseMedia Website Parent FAQ and Tips tab has tons of information on anything from cyber secutriy to parental contorls on each of the varoious social medial platforms that our Bobcats use commonly. Tips and practices vary from age to age, so it is highly relevant for any member of your family that use soical media.

If you are interested in ways that you can help your Bobcat deal with bullying, there is a short online course called <u>Bullying Prevention and Intervention for Parents and Caregivers</u> that you may wish to take advantage of. It is a free course but please use the link to get more information and to sign up for this online course. This can be completed at your own pace. Topics cover include: defining bullyling, how bullying impacts children, strategies to teach children what to do if they are being bullied and strategies to teach children what to do if they see someone else being bullied.

Good Afternoon SDUHSD Community,

As we begin the second half of the school year, I extend my sincere appreciation for your unwavering support and involvement in our educational community. I am pleased to share that the SDUHSD District Office modernization project has reached completion. Our district office, located at 710 Encinitas Boulevard, is now open for operations from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm.

At our board meeting this week, we received an annual update from Pacific Trails Middle School and an overview presentation of the SDUHSD student performance data as summarized on the California Dashboard. Overall, we have a lot to celebrate.

- Our students continue to have high levels of academic achievement.
- Our high schools have very high graduation rates, and our middle schools have seen a decline in chronic absenteeism.

As we move forward and use the Dashboard to inform our Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP), we are going to be paying close attention to specialized student groups.

Additional Board Meeting Highlights

Aquatics Facility at Torrey Pines: The Board stated its intent to build an aquatics facility at Torrey Pines High School and directed the Superintendent to collaborate with staff and the community to present details about how to fund and accomplish this project.

Governance Handbook: This is a document that is agreed upon by the Superintendent and all five members of the Board of Education which outlines how the team will work together.

Approval of this handbook, a first for SDUHSD, is a reflection of the governance team's commitment to working effectively in a way that best benefits all students.

As Superintendent, together with the Governing Board, we are united in providing a high-quality education for each and every student to demonstrate academic growth and optimize individual potential.
