OFF CAMPUS PASSES - If your student needs to leave school for a doctor's appointment, etc., they must report to the Attendance Office for an off-campus pass. You should contact the office by telephone or note <u>before school</u> on the day of the appointment with the specified time to be dismissed from class. <u>This way the student will be in the office and the parent will not have to wait.</u> For student safety, it is recommended that parents or guardians come into the office and pick up their students.

ATTENDANCE - Your student's daily attendance is an essential part of their education. When your student is absent you should call the school *each day of their absence*, not when they return to school. If you do not call, your student must provide a note. We need to know why your student is not at school.

ABSENCES - A student's absence must be cleared by a parent or guardian within 48 hours by way of (1) telephone verification (2) a note or (3) an email to the Attendance Secretary.

How to Excuse Your Student from PE in the event of an illness or injury.

There always seems to be a little confusion around how to excuse your student in PE from a single-class medical or injury absence. *Always* go to the PE teacher - students can do this themselves or parents are welcome to send them a note or email. PE teachers then accommodate the student based on the medical reason or injury and the activities for that day.

A medical note for PE - is different. If your student is going to be missing multiple days of PE a medical note is required. That medical note should be given to the Attendance or Health office which will make sure it is distributed to all the correct staff members including the PE teacher.

Message from Our Superintendent - Dr. Anne Staffieri

Good afternoon SDUHSD Community,

Thank you for your ongoing support and efforts on behalf of the San Dieguito Union High School District. We are pleased to share that our District has been recently recognized by Niche Rankings as the No. 1 best school district in San Diego County, No. 2 in the state, and No. 18 in the country. We continue to prioritize excellent teaching and learning and supporting all students in their academic success. Sustained academic success takes place when the culture across our district on every school campus supports every student feeling that they belong, that they are included, seen, heard, and respected.

Beginning in January, we will join with the National Conflict Resolution Center in a new, multi- year partnership, the One San Dieguito Initiative. The goal of the One San Dieguito initiative is to work collaboratively to create a more supportive and inclusive environment that enables all students to feel a greater sense of belonging and achieve their academic goals. All of our educational partners including staff, students, parents, and community members will be invited to work together on this initiative. We will develop a comprehensive plan that includes a training program focused on developing communication, culture, and conflict resolution skills. We look forward to sharing details and future opportunities to become involved in the coming months.

Finally, for many in our community the horrific terror attack on October 7 and subsequent war between Israel and Hamas has had a direct impact. Many of our students are suffering as they grieve the loss of friends and family. Around the world and here at home, we are anxiously awaiting word about the hostages being held. Our Jewish and Muslim students are both expressing fear and uncertainty during this time, and it is our job to maintain a safe environment in which they can grow and thrive.

I want to emphasize that we do not tolerate anti-semitism or discrimination of any kind. I am meeting with various community members and we are working to address the short and long term needs of our students. Some of this will be seen, and some of this will not, but know that we are making our students our top priority. All are encouraged to demonstrate increased empathy, compassion, and kindness towards others.

As we continue to provide support to our students and families, please remember to make use of the WeTip Anonymous Reporting platform to report instances of bullying, harassment, discrimination or any other incident on campus, in the classroom or in the community.

Attendance Office

Absences

If your student will be absent from school, leaving early or arriving late, please notify our Attendance Office IN ADVANCE by email or phone. To report an absence please be prepared with:

- Student's name (with spelling) and Student ID #
- Your name and relationship to student
- The reason for the absence
- The date of the absence
- A contact phone number

When emailing, please specify in the subject line "Absence" and include the above listed information. For absences related to illness, please contact the attendance office for each day your student is absent. For personal business absences, such as travel, one email is sufficient with the reason and dates your student is absent. One quick reminder to use the email address that you have registered in Aeries when you email attendance.

Appointments During School

If your student is leaving early with an off-campus pass, please provide the same info as above. Please state the reason, time, and if they are returning. After you have done this, please ask your student to pick up their off-campus pass from the front office before school, passing period, and lunch.

If your student is going to be picked up early from school by one of your emergency contacts, please inform the front office via phone or email ahead of time.

Health Office

Student Medications - Students who take continuing prescribed or over the counter medication during school hours will need an Authorization to Administer Medication form filled out and signed by a parent and doctor. Turn in completed forms and medications to the Health Office. Please note that a new form is required for each new school year. Students may NOT carry any medication on campus (with the exception of asthma inhalers and Epipens, provided the required forms are on file with the Health Office).

ILL OR INJURED STUDENTS

If a student becomes ill or injured during the day, it is important they ask their teacher for a pass to the Health Office to check out from there. Students should NOT make arrangements to go home by calling or texting their parent(s) from class. If it is determined that they need to go home, a parent, quardian, or emergency contact will be notified. Keep your student home for 24 hours after the following conditions: fever has subsided (without fever reducing medications), vomiting has stopped, or starting antibiotics, including those for eye and skin infections.
