ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Some reminders regarding student attendance:

ATTENDANCE/HOMEWORK

Daily attendance is an essential part of your student's education. When your student is absent a parent or guardian should call the school *each day of their absence*, NOT when they return to school. If a call is not made, students must bring a note. We need to know why your student was not at school.

THE ONLY VALID EXCUSES PER STATE LAW ARE LISTED BELOW. ANY OTHER IS CONSIDERED UNEXCUSED:

- *Illness
- *Medical appointments
- *Religious holidays
- *Mandated court appearance
- *Death in the immediate family

REMEMBER– A student's absence must be cleared by a parent or guardian within 48 hours by way of (1) telephone verification (2) a note or (3) an email to the Attendance Secretary.

Message from the Superintendent's Office

Good Afternoon SDUHSD Community,

As we begin the second half of the school year, I extend my sincere appreciation for your unwavering support and involvement in our educational community. I am pleased to share that the SDUHSD District Office modernization project has reached completion. Our district office, located at 710 Encinitas Boulevard, is now open for operations from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm.

At our board meeting this week, we received an annual update from Pacific Trails Middle School and an overview presentation of the SDUHSD student performance data as summarized on the California Dashboard. Overall, we have a lot to celebrate.

- Our students continue to have high levels of academic achievement.
- Our high schools have very high graduation rates, and our middle schools have seen a decline in chronic absenteeism.

As we move forward and use the Dashboard to inform our Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP), we are going to be paying close attention to specialized student groups.

Additional Board Meeting Highlights

Aquatics Facility at Torrey Pines: The Board stated its intent to build an aquatics facility at Torrey Pines High School and directed the Superintendent to collaborate with staff and the community to present details about how to fund and accomplish this project.

Governance Handbook: This is a document that is agreed upon by the Superintendent and all five members of the Board of Education which outlines how the team will work together.

Approval of this handbook, a first for SDUHSD, is a reflection of the governance team's commitment to working effectively in a way that best benefits all students.

As Superintendent, together with the Governing Board, we are united in providing a high-quality education for each and every student to demonstrate academic growth and optimize individual potential.
