

GENERAL RULES & GUIDELINES

BIKES/SKATEBOARDS/SCOOTERS/E-BIKES/HELMETS

Bicycles, skateboards, scooters, and e-bikes must be parked and should be LOCKED in the bike compound near the staff parking lot at all times. The compound is open before and after school each day. Bicycles/skateboards/Scotters/E-Bikes are NOT to be ridden on campus, on the sidewalks or in the parking lot. Students MUST wear a helmet. WALK IT! LOCK IT! LEAVE IT!

IT'S YOUR BIRTHDAY??/VALENTINE'S DAY??

NO BALLOONS, FLOWERS, or BIRTHDAY TREATS (i.e. cupcakes, etc.) are allowed at school. Celebrations should be reserved for after school. Additionally, celebrations involving food are prohibited for health, cleanliness, and safety reasons.

MOBILE TECHNOLOGY

Carmel Valley Middle School recognizes the importance of communication and collaboration and provides Chromebooks for students to be productive in the classroom. Cell phones and other personal electronic devices will be silenced and put away in a student's backpack/bag once a student arrives on campus until they leave campus. The expectation is that students do not use their cell phones and/or personal devices throughout the school day without explicit prior permission. Cell phones, AirPods, and other personal devices are not allowed to be used in classrooms (unless teacher gives explicit consent), or in locker rooms or restrooms at any time. Taking photos or videos in these locations will result in an acceleration of consequences. Please see page 14 For more details.

***NOTICE OF NON-RESPONSIBILITY**

SDUHSD is NOT responsible for the personal property , or money of students or employees. Personal items are brought to school at the owner's risk. Please remember to mark all items with your name. LOCK your bike, scooter, skateboard and PE locker at all times and don't share locker combination with friends. (Refer to page 18)

PARENT CALLS & MESSAGES

We limit classroom interruption! Lunches, supplies, forgotten books and assignments, or telephone messages cannot be delivered to students in class. If your parents dropped something off for you, please check the message board outside the Assistant Principal's Office whenever you forget an item.

REPORT CARDS/AERIES PORTAL

24 hours a day, 7 days a week, students and parents can check on the Aeries Portal for homework assignments, grades, attendance, etc. All progress reports and semester report cards are posted on Aeries and will not be mailed home.

CHROMEBOOKS AND TEXTBOOKS

Students are responsible for Chromebooks and textbooks checked out to them at the start of the year until they return them at the end of the year. (1) Students will pay for books lost, stolen, damaged, or if Chromebooks or books indicate careless use.

(2) Students can only turn in their assigned Chromebook & books.

IDENTIFICATION ON CAMPUS

To provide a safe campus, adults must enter the campus through the front office where they will produce a valid ID to be run through our RAPTOR system that clears their presence on our campus. Cleared adults must wear their RAPTOR badge while on campus. The CVMS campus is CLOSED to all student visitors from other schools. Students are expected to carry their student ID card while on campus.

ORDERING FOOD TO THE SCHOOL

Students are not permitted to order food from outside vendors for delivery at CVMS. Students need to bring a lunch and snacks from home or pick up food at the Bobcat Grill.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Students are required to provide proof of residency to the Registrar when submitting a change of address. All students are required to have an emergency contact person on file with a telephone number and email address where their parents can be reached during the school day.

SDUHSD ACADEMIC HONESTY POLICY

Honest behavior is an expectation for all students in the San Dieguito Union High School District. The purpose of this regulation is to create and maintain an ethical academic atmosphere.

SPECIFIC TYPES OF ACADEMIC DISHONESTY NOT TOLERATED ARE DEFINED BELOW:

1. **Cheating:** (assignments, tests, quizzes, examinations, running laps) – Any intentional giving of or use of external assistance relating to an examination, test, quiz or assignments without express permission of the teacher. This includes looking on another student’s paper, sharing answers, copying another student’s paper, talking during a test (it does not matter what you are talking about), using an electronic device without permission during a test or Assignment, using Artificial Intelligence to complete a test or assignment, or cutting corners during the Superlap/Mile Run in PE.
2. **Fabrication:** Any intentional falsification or invention of data citation, or other authority in an academic exercise.
3. **Unauthorized Collaboration:** While collaboration is often encouraged, unauthorized collaboration is not permitted. (Make sure you have teacher permission.)
4. **Plagiarism:** Any intentional representation of another’s ideas, words, or work as one’s own. Plagiarism includes the misuse of published material, electronic material, and/or the work of other students. The original writer who intentionally shares his/her paper for another to copy, without the permission of the teacher, is also engaged in plagiarism.
5. **Alteration of Materials:** Any intentional and unauthorized alteration of student, teacher, or library materials.
6. **Forgery:** Any unauthorized signing of another person’s name to school related documents.
7. **Theft:** Any theft of materials.
8. **Transfer of Unauthorized Materials:** Any giving or selling of unauthorized material.

CONSEQUENCES FOR ACADEMIC DISHONESTY

Any alleged violation of this policy will be investigated thoroughly and appropriate disciplinary measures will be taken consistent with SDUHSD School Board policy.

Depending on the severity of the offense, one or more of the following consequences may occur:

- Referral to the Assistant Principal and the parent/guardian will be contacted.
- Loss of all credit for the assignment or test with no makeup permitted.
- Placement on an Academic Honesty Contract.
- Detention

If repeated, the consequences are more severe and include:

- Referral to the Student Study Team (SST).
- Suspension from school, which includes school activities (i.e., dances, etc.).
- Removal from all elected or appointed leadership positions for the remainder of the school year.
- Violation on a school administered national/state exam will result in a district code of conduct violation

CVMS Cell Phone & Other Personal Devices Policy for 2022-2023

Carmel Valley Middle School recognizes the importance of communication and collaboration and provides Chromebooks for students to be productive in the classroom. To keep the focus on academics and to reduce unnecessary distractions, the school will be enforcing the following:



Cell phones and other personal electronic devices will be silenced and put away once a student arrives on campus until they leave campus. The expectation is that students do not use their cell phones, headphones/ear buds and/or other personal devices throughout the school day without explicit prior permission.

Cell phones, headphones/earbuds, and other personal devices will be kept in a student's backpack/bag (not in clothing pockets).

Cell phones, headphones/earbuds, and other personal devices are not allowed to be used in locker rooms or restrooms at any time. Taking photos or videos in these locations will result in an acceleration of consequences (below).

Smart watches may not be accessed during school hours, except as a timepiece.

If a student needs to make an urgent call during the day, they are to come to the office. Families are encouraged to make after-school arrangements before the start of the school day to alleviate the student's need to check their phone. That said, if a parent/guardian needs to reach their student during the day, they can call/email the office and we will get a message to the student. Accommodations may be made for students who access their phone or personal devices for medical reasons.

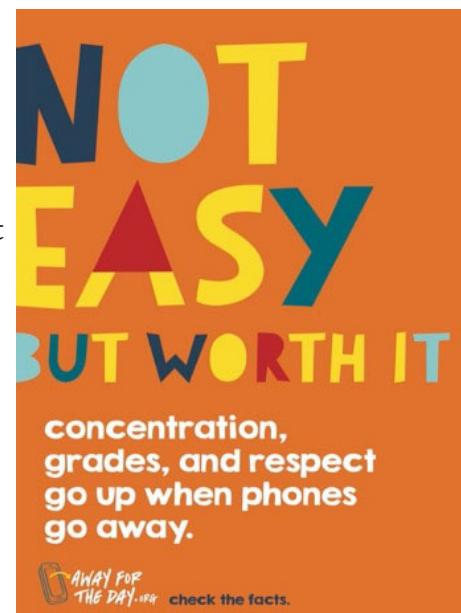
Consequences for personal device violations will be documented in Aeries as follows:

1st offense: Student can pick up their device from the office at the end of the day.

2nd offense: Student can pick up their device from the office at the end of the day and will serve a detention the following day.

3rd offense: Parent/guardian can pick up their student's device from the office at the end of the day and student will serve two detentions the following two days

4th offense: Meeting with administration to develop personal electronics plan/contract. May result in loss of privileges. Student will serve three detentions the following two days.



At CVMS, the first approach in addressing any behavior related matter is to institute restorative measures that emphasize learning and understating. The charts below outline general policies and procedures. While each behavior incident is considered individually, appropriate restorative measures are applied first with repeated infractions being followed by progressively more restrictive consequences. The following information is intended to provide students, parents, and staff with a common understanding of the general expectations and, in the case restorative measures alone are insufficient to change behavior, possible consequences for misbehavior.

SCHOOL DRESS CODE

Carmel Valley Middle School respects the right of students to express themselves in the attire that they choose to wear. Clothes worn to school should be appropriate for school activities and not distracting to the educational environment. CVMS administration reserves the right to determine what is appropriate dress. When a violation of the dress code occurs, the student will be required to wear a “loaner” for the day, return home for proper attire, or have clothing brought from home to school.

Clothing and accessories (including backpacks) that include the following are unacceptable and not allowed on campus:

- advertise and/or promote drugs, alcohol, vape, and/or tobacco products;
- display vulgar or sexually suggestive language or symbols
- advocate or depict illegal, violent, or lewd conduct conduct, and/or depict weapons
- discriminate against race, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, religious affiliation, or any other protected classification
- advertise, suggest, or promote gang affiliation

Additional Guidelines:

- Footwear must be worn at all times.
- Clothing must adequately cover the body.
- Undergarments and private body parts must not show.
- All pants and shorts must be secured at the waist.
- Student appearance may not cause distractions or safety concerns to the student or school environment.

L. O. P. (LOSS OF PRIVILEGE LIST)

Repeated infractions or a serious single infraction may cause the administration may to place your name on an LOP List. For the period of time your name is on the list, you may not participate in any extracurricular activities or other campus based activities identified by administrators. Examples of privileges that may be lost include, but are not limited to: school dances, field trips, and night events as well as computer access for non-school activities, lunchtime activities, choice of lunchtime seating area.

NOTICE: The San Dieguito Union High School District is not responsible for the personal property of students or employees. Items such as cell phones, headphones/earbuds or other personal electronic devices, musical instruments, clothing, jewelry, equipment, bicycles, skateboards, electronic organizers, or other personal property, if brought to school, are at the owner’s risk. Please remember to lock your PE locker at all times and not to share the locker combination with friends.

TECHNOLOGY USE POLICY

All students and parents/guardians sign an Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) for technology use on campus. Any violations of the AUP are subject to disciplinary action. The following are major areas covered in the AUP.

- Students use appropriate language, manners and ethics when accessing technology
- Students report problems, abuses, or misuses of technology resources to your teacher, counselor or an administrator.
- Students cannot access others' email accounts.
- Students cannot attempt to bypass or alter computers or our network.
- Students cannot bypass restrictions regarding technology use.
- Students cannot use school computers for:
 - Gaming
 - Commercial purposes
 - Illegal activities

EMAIL POLICY

Student use of email must abide by the generally accepted rules and principles of email etiquette, as well as the guidelines outlined in the AUP. To help keep students safe, students are asked to never give out personal information of any kind through email. Additionally, the following activities are not permitted:

- Sending or displaying offensive messages or pictures;
- Using obscene language;
- Harassing, insulting or attacking others;
- Using another students' login or password;
- Corresponding or meeting with someone through the Internet without the pre-approval of a teacher;
- Accessing or downloading inappropriate materials;
- Reposting a message sent to the user privately without the permission of the person who sent the message.

BULLYING AND CYBERBULLYING

Appropriate student behavior that leads to a positive school environment is expected when students use technology. Cyber bullying involves the use of information and communication technologies such as social media applications, text messages, instant messaging, defamatory personal websites, and online personal polling websites, to support deliberate, repeated, and hostile behavior by an individual or group, which is intended to harm others.

Any communication that disrupts or prevents a safe and positive educational environment will also be considered cyber bullying. Students whose behavior is found to be in violation of this policy will be subject to discipline and loss of privileges, up to and including expulsion. Third parties whose behavior is found to be in violation of this policy will also be subject to appropriate disciplinary action.
